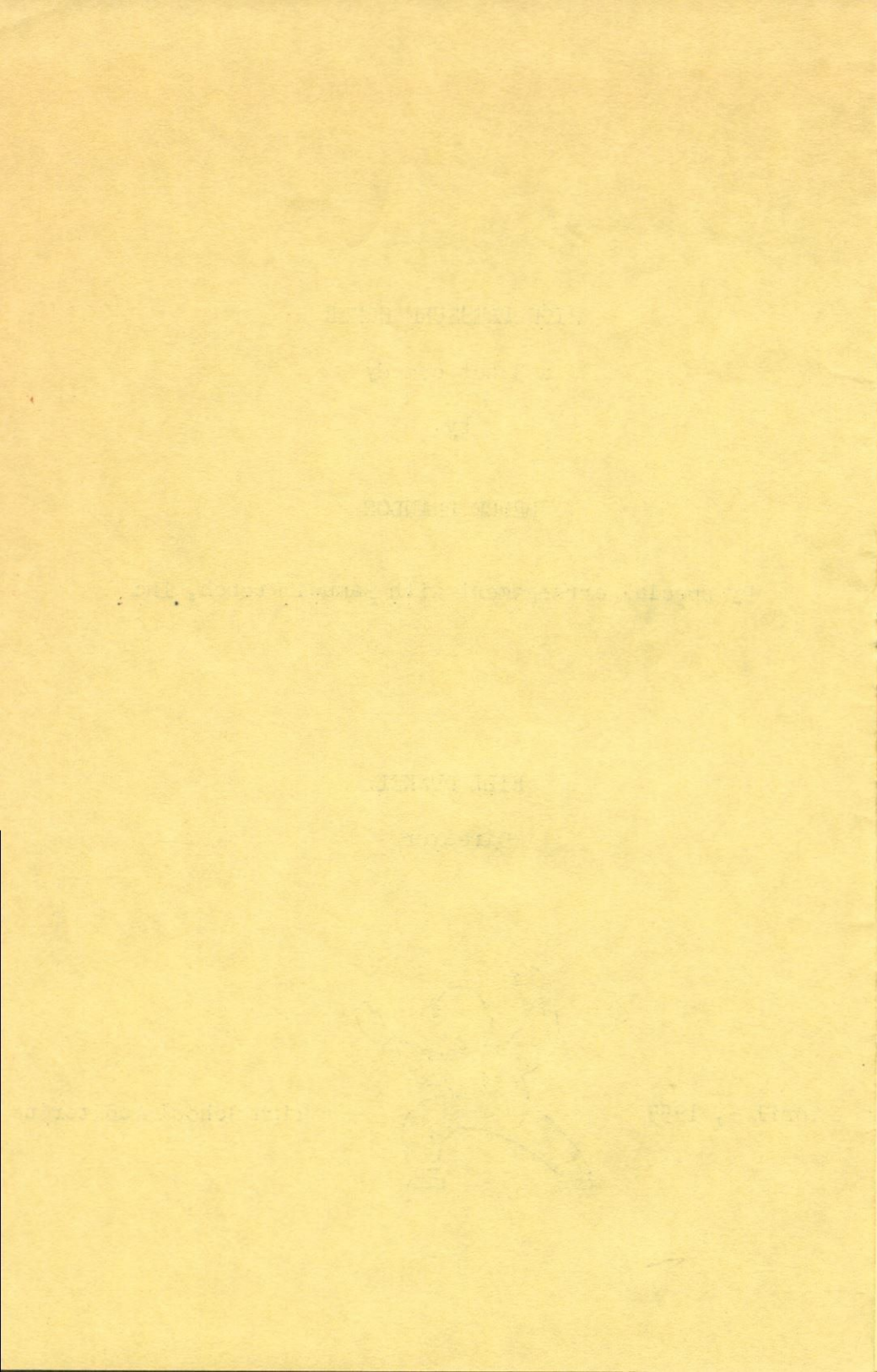

SYNOPSIS OF SCENES

The entire action of the play takes place in the living room of the Woodruff family, in a medium-sized Eastern town.

TIME: The present

ACT I: Late afternoon in June

ACT II: Afternoon; two weeks later

ACT III: Noon: two weeks later

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE JURY

1. The first question for you to decide is whether the defendant was present at the scene of the crime. If you find that he was not present, you must return a verdict of not guilty. If you find that he was present, you must go on to the next question.

2. The second question for you to decide is whether the defendant acted with the intent to commit the crime. If you find that he did not act with the intent, you must return a verdict of not guilty. If you find that he did act with the intent, you must go on to the next question.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE JURY

3. The third question for you to decide is whether the defendant acted with the knowledge that his conduct was unlawful. If you find that he did not act with the knowledge, you must return a verdict of not guilty. If you find that he did act with the knowledge, you must go on to the next question.

4. The fourth question for you to decide is whether the defendant acted with the recklessness that the law requires. If you find that he did not act with the recklessness, you must return a verdict of not guilty. If you find that he did act with the recklessness, you must go on to the next question.
